

A Common Objection Answered

God's love overcame our unbelief and disobedience.

We are all born 'children of disobedience.' (Ephesians 2:2).

Obedience is proof of our loving God:

Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me (John 14:21).

Disobedient children do not love God:

Anyone who doesn't love me will not obey me (John 14:24 NLT).

However, when God sovereignly bestows His love upon a child of disobedience, that once disobedient child becomes obedient, proving his love for God.

For from God's love proceed all the spiritual gifts necessary to fulfill the conditions of salvation; including repentance, faith, justification, sanctification, good works, love of the brethren, love of the truth, etc.

God's love brings those chosen 'haters' to Him, converting them to Christ, in whom they will experience His love for all eternity.

God's love never fails to save:

*Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, **having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end** (John 13:1).*
